University of Georgia Code of Conduct Regulation 4: Alcohol and Other Drug Related Misconduct

- 4.1 Use or possession of alcoholic beverages except as permitted by law and University Alcohol and Other Drug Policies.
- 4.2 Providing, distributing, selling, or facilitating the use or possession of alcoholic beverages except as permitted by law and University Alcohol and Other Drug Policies.

 4.3 Disruptive or disorderly conduct caused by the influence of alcohol and/or other drugs.
 - 4.4 Use or possession of narcotic or other controlled substances except as permitted by law and University Alcohol and Other Drug Policies.
- 4.5 Providing, distributing, selling, or facilitating the use or possession of narcotic or other controlled substances except as permitted by law and University Alcohol and Other Drug Policies.

When a student is found in violation of Regulation 4, through informal or formal resolution, a MINIMUM of the following sanctions will occur: Possession (not consumption) of alcohol, or Alcohol education program and A Level I Violation is defined as possession, use, probation for 6 months from the facilitating the possession (not consumption) Level 1 or facilitating the possession/use of alcohol. of alcohol by others. date of resolution. The University of Georgia considers Level II violations to be more egregious in nature than Level 2 Suspension from the institution. Sale of illegal drugs or controlled substances. Level I. Sanctions will likely include at least ONE of the following: Subsequent violations of Regulation 4 involving the operation of a motor vehicle: Advanced Alcohol and Other Drug education program, Any subsequent violation, while on probation for a prior alcohol/drug violation, Subsequent additional probation, community service hours, involving the operation of a motor vehicle after consumption of alcohol and/or use of violations of suspension from the institution. drugs will result in suspension. **Regulation 4** *Additional sanctions may be determined by the level of Any second violation, regardless of probation status, involving the operation of a motor while on the violation (I or II), circumstances of the case and the vehicle after consumption of alcohol and/or use of drugs when a prior violation also probation student's prior record, including the conditions of involved the operation of a motor vehicle after consuming alcohol and/or using drugs probation from any prior record. will result in suspension.
