

P2P Programs on Windows Vista

Using file sharing or peer-to-peer (P2P) programs to download/share copyrighted materials (or just having copyrighted materials in a shared file on your computer) is a violation of the UGA Code of Conduct. Organizations representing copyrighted industries monitor the UGA network and report to UGA when someone on the network has inappropriately shared files.

How to remove a P2P Program

Just as you would remove any program from your Windows system, use the **Add/Remove Programs** window in the **Control Panel** to remove (uninstall) these programs.

1. Close and turn off all file sharing programs and their components
2. Click **Start**
3. Open the **Control Panel**
 - Click **Control Panel** or
 - Click **Settings > Control Panel**
4. Click **Programs and Features**
5. Click once to highlight the software you would like to remove, then click on the **Uninstall** button at the top of the list of programs
 - Follow the prompts on the screen to completely remove the software and all its components
6. Restart your computer when all uninstallations are complete

How to Disable File Sharing on Windows Vista

To disable simple file sharing, just follow these steps:

1. From the Start menu, click **Control Panel**
2. In the **Control Panel**, click **Network and Internet**
3. Click **Network and Sharing Center**
4. Expand this section by clicking the button next to **File Sharing**
5. Click the circle button marked **Turn Off File Sharing**
6. Click **Apply** for changes to take effect

Disabling file sharing may have an effect on other computer programs and does not insure the legality of your media. Be sure to also delete any P2P program from your computer.
